Hockey Ireland are seeking to employ a Regional Development Officer for Munster. Starting in October 2021, this person will help to grow hockey, support and develop existing/new resources in the Munster region, an area that Hockey Ireland see as having huge potential for growth.

Led by Hockey Ireland, in conjunction with Munster Hockey, the successful applicant will be responsible for the delivery of and will have input into the planning for Hockey Ireland's National Development Plan. Working to achieve these targets, the Regional Development Officer (Munster) is responsible for administering and delivering programmes to promote sustainable participation opportunities within clubs, schools and 3rd level colleges in Munster.

JOB TITLE: Regional Development Officer, Munster

RESPONSIBLE TO: Hockey Ireland, National Development Manager

LOCATION: Munster Region

REMUNERATION: The package will include a competitive salary range commensurate with qualifications, skills and experience. The position is full time and 2-year fixed term.

Responsibilities include:

Growing hockey in Munster

- Promoting Munster hockey through community and school engagement to increase club numbers at both adult and junior level
- Particular focus on growing boy's hockey in Munster
- Establishing and developing Hockey4All in Munster
- Promoting and development hockey in third level colleges (e.g. UCC, UL, MIC, WIT, MTU)
- Management and administration of development programmes including ClubMark,
 Tricks4Sticks etc.
- Identifying key areas for new clubs and helping with the administration involved in setting up a club.
- Act as link between clubs and schools and identify and support clubs to develop ways to increase volunteers, coaches and umpires.
- To increase participation.
- Promoting and developing the indoor format of the game across the province in both clubs and schools
- Working in partnership with LSP/ local councils and helping clubs to identify and apply for funding opportunities
- Establish and promote Vets and social hockey and support Master's Hockey



Supporting existing clubs

- Delivering workshops and holding meetings to support, educate and empower clubs to implement change and become more sustainable
- Supporting clubs to improve current and develop new facilities

Coach umpire and volunteer development

- Deliver Young Hockey Leaders Award and Young Umpire Program
- Creating coach and volunteer development opportunities
- Identifying need for Tricks4Sticks, Coaching and Umpiring courses and linking with HI
 Coaching Education to ensure these are set up.

General:

- Respond promptly to club queries.
- Working to specific targets in relation to delivery of Hockey Ireland participation and development programmes as agreed with NDM.
- Work closely with the Munster Branch and proactively develop strong relationships with schools and clubs in the region
- Improve the profile and exposure of Munster Hockey
- Work closely with other Hockey Ireland and Munster Hockey staff and volunteers
- Attend appropriate meetings as directed by National Development Manager or Munster Hockey Branch
- Assist in applying for funding and delivering on funding requirements
- Work in partnership with other sporting bodies
- Any other duties as may be allocated from time to time in accordance with the general nature of the post
- Access to private transport is required as successful candidate will need to travel throughout the Munster region. This role requires flexibility with regards to working hours.

It should be noted that the role of the development officer is not to work at the performance level of the sport (with interprovincial teams for example, or with current 3rd level teams) and the main focus is to build participation and systems to support sustainable growth, including strengthening existing structures.
