Terry Gregg is one of the most successful men's players to have graced Irish hockey. In his sparkling ten year international career he scored 67 goals and was the second men's players to amass 100 caps for Ireland – a remarkable feat considering he was forced to retire relatively early aged 29. Gregg captained the Irish side from 1975-79 and also had a very successful international career with Great Britain, for whom he won 42 caps. Indeed, he played every game for Great Britain from 1972-80, vice-captaining the side from 1974-80 and competing in the 1972 Munich Olympic Games. After retiring, Gregg forged a very successful coaching career and was the coach of the Irish women's team when Ireland hosted the Waterford Crystal Women's World Cup in Dublin in 1994.
