

ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW - PLAYER TRANSERS, NEW PLAYERS FROM IRELAND AND ABROAD

First things first!

- A player can only be registered to play <u>with one club</u> in one hockey jurisdiction throughout the world at any one time
- A player can only play for one club in any one season, unless a valid transfer is completed in line with local competition regulations
- There is a global FIH player release process for when a player moves from one country to another (i.e. player going abroad, player returning home, foreign player coming to Ireland), known as NOC.
- For EYHL Division 1, Hockey Ireland require the receiving club to seek and receive a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the previous country or club before the player can be registered to play for the receiving club.

New Player Scenarios – What you need to know and do

New Player to your club transferring from another club within Hockey Ireland

- The receiving club need to request the transfer from the previous club before the player can register to the new club on GameDay
- The transfer needs to happen within the 'transfer window' applicable to your province if in doubt, ASK either your provincial or HI competition person before acting!
- DO NOT create a duplicate of the player to avoid the transfer process your club will be fined or subject to penalty!

New Player to your club transferring from outside of Hockey Ireland

• If likely to play in EYHL Division One, the receiving club (or player) need to request a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the previous club (or federation) and be <u>cleared to play</u> <u>by Hockey Ireland</u> before they can complete registration on GameDay and be considered a bone fide member of the club.

New Player from outside of Hockey Ireland AND who does NOT hold Irish/UK/EU nationality

 In addition to requiring a No Objection Certificate (step above), a player likely to play in EYHL Division One, needs to provide evidence of the Right to Live & Work in Ireland / Northern Ireland prior to receiving clearance to play from Hockey Ireland.

Steps to take – New /returning players to Hockey Ireland

- 1. Where applicable, get the player to request their NOC from their previous club (or federation). Make sure it has the minimum required fields and signed.
- 2. Send the completed NOC (or get the player to send) to Hockey Ireland and ask for clearance to play. If the player doesn't hold an IRL /UK /EU passport, then request the player to contact competitions@hockey.ie to discuss what permits will be required as proof of Right to Live & Work to achieve clearance to play
- 3. Once the clearance to play email has been received from either Hockey Ireland or the provincial branch, the player can complete their GameDay registration
- 4. Hold onto a copy of all paperwork, including the clearance to play, for proof of eligibility
