CONTEXT

Hockey Ireland is the National Governing Body for hockey on the island of Ireland. Our Women's Senior Team narrowly missed out on qualification for the Paris Olympic Games, and most recently finished second at Nations Cup. Our u21 team have qualified for Junior World Cup 2025.

The medium-term strategic performance objective for Hockey Ireland is to become and sustain Ireland as a Top 8 nation by 2030. We are currently looking to recruit an u21 Women's Team Head Coach who takes a dual role as second assistant coach to the Senior Women's Team, to lead and deliver our Women's u21 Programme, and support the Senior Women's Programme.

The Head Coach will be a key leader in the Hockey Ireland ecosystem, working with the wider organisation, senior programme staff (men & women), and into the pathway to develop Ireland's capacity as a leading hockey nation. The position will be based primarily at Hockey Ireland headquarters at the Sport Ireland Campus at Abbottstown, Dublin. The nature of the role demands a national brief across the 32 counties of Ireland as well as travel overseas. The successful candidate will be required to reside in Ireland full-time and should therefore have the required visa.

PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE JOB:

The U21 National Team and Breakthrough Programme is a critical link between Junior Age Group and Senior International hockey. The purpose of this role is to ensure:

- Identified future senior internationals gain high quality, consistent international programme and competition experience, developing capacity to break through to senior squad and have impact within year 1.
- U21 national team is prepared to perform at European and World level, with the aim of achieving a top 12 finish at JWC 2025.
- There is alignment and connection between senior and u21 teams, staff, principles of play, processes and practices, in order to advance development players into Senior Team environment

They will demonstrate the required coaching and leadership attributes, an understanding of high performance and the current trends in international hockey, and the capability to deliver a programme which will convert pathway players to senior internationals, and ensure Ireland become a consistent presence at Junior World Cups.

- Level 3 and/or FIH coaching qualifications or equivalent (or working towards them)
- Up to date Safeguarding Level 1 certificate or commitment to complete with 1 month of starting date
- Experience in planning, organising and implementing a comprehensive domestic or international coaching programme
- Understanding and experience of the demands of high performance sport
- Excellent communications (verbal and written)
- Ability to apply the principles of coaching, sport science, medicine and technology within a high performance programme
- Exceptional people skills, with an emphasis on the management of player and coach personnel
- Capacity to travel domestically and overseas for extended periods

- An understanding of the Irish sporting landscape, culture and mentality
